

Aline Newman's latest book for National Geographic is a chapter book for younger readers than her previous books about animals. This publication contains three sections with three chapters. *Rascally Rabbits* begins with a true story about Sniffles and the bunny's protectors, Sparky and Boo Boo, the family dog and cat. Chapters two and three are about a big rabbit named Babbity who becomes best friends with Flopsy the goat. The middle section of the book is about the antics of Yellow-Yellow, a bandit bear in the Adirondack Mountains. Not only was he a tricky thief, he was also a genius at breaking into camper's food stashes. The final section tells about Moose, an abandoned black problem pup that the author and her husband rescued one nasty winter evening on the Moose River Road in the central Adirondacks. This dog was nothing but trouble. He had some lovable traits, but his bad habits seemed to outnumber them. Because he was prone to run

away, his owners put his name and their cell phone number on his collar. Not too long afterwards he escaped from the family car and ended up in the local grocery store. His family would have been angry with him had they not concluded he had come looking for them. Interspersed throughout all these human interest stories are full page color photos and inserts with information about rabbits, black bears and dogs that young children will find as interesting as the stories themselves.-Hope Irvin Marston, author of EYE ON THE IDITAROD: AISLING'S QUEST

We know that lions, tigers and bears are just a few of the animals that can behave badly, but what about bunnies? People have been taming rabbits for over 500 years. But, not all rabbits are friendly and cuddly. Rabbits can be anywhere from 3 pounds to 20 pounds in size which means they could pack a punch in order to protect themselves. Rabbits can warn each other by thumping their feet. They can also see what's behind them without turning their heads. If challenged rabbits will fight. For example, the story of Babbity and Flopsy, in this book, shares how these two foes fought by butting heads. Both animals soon acquired a mutual respect for one another. Young readers can follow along and learn more about Babbity and Flopsy. This book is not without bears, dogs and even moose. There are loads of fun facts, fantastic photography and plenty of resources to learn more. Parents and teachers will want to add this treasure to any library.
