

Very useful book, great for the medical student. I was highly motivated and able to get through the text because I found the material to be interesting and useful, however, many students will not have the stamina to read a book this dense during their rotation. Depending on personal interest in the subject matter and personal study habits, this may or may not be the book for you.

I needed this book for my women's health class in PA school. I did not find it particularly helpful. It was hard to navigate the chapters to find the information I needed to. Most of the explanations given weren't very concise or useful. The redeeming quality of this book is that it had some very helpful charts. I am sure you can find charts and pictures that are better, however, so I'd pick up a different textbook.

Of all the OB/Gyn texts out there, I believe this does the best job of breaking down and adequately explaining the menstrual cycle. I gave it 4stars because the topic of contraception was not elaborated in this book. I had to look elsewhere :-)

It's a great intro for the clerkship but I found it didn't go into enough specific details about treatment. This book will give you a great overview of treatment options, but when you are studying for the shelf you really need to know how to prioritize those treatment options.
