

I bought this first edition of this workbook and the companion text when they came out and have referred to them through several career changes. Now that we're in the internet age and I'm at middle age, I figured it was time to upgrade. The basic concepts are still there but the workbook feels more complicated to use. And I didn't like the idea of having to "cut out" items to rearrange them on the page. (Making copies of the voting pages is how I managed to keep my first edition in pristine condition.) Even so, the book is still very helpful. It confirmed the things I'd learned about myself many years ago and helped me decide where my career is headed next.

The workbook provided a process of helping me find myself and what I want to do next with my life. I have been laid off since March 2008.
